For the final exam, be able to:

- Given a sentence with a predicate (N,A, or V), add correct case particles.
- Given a sentence with case particles, provide the appropriate form of a given verb.
- Given a “meaning” (e.g., in English), provide appropriate contrast particles.
- Given a “meaning” (e.g., in English), provide appropriate verb forms.
- Given a “meaning” (e.g., in English), provide appropriate info-sourcing expressions.
- Given a “meaning” (e.g., in English), provide appropriate time expressions.
- Given a “meaning” (e.g., in English), provide appropriate quantity expressions.
- Given a complex sentence, provide a parsing diagram.
- Given a complex sentence, split it into separate, smaller sentences.
- Given a basic sentence, reframe the syntax:
  - a. to highlight the noun, for incorporation into a complex sentence.
  - b. to provide more natural order (e.g., with quantity expressions).
- Given basic sentences, combine them into a single complete sentence.
- Given a complex sentence, provide appropriate phrase connections.
- Given a sentence and lexical accent information, provide an accent contour.
- Given a sentence with an accent contour, extract lexical accent information.
- Given a sentence (including commands), change it to make it more or less distal.
- Given an essay paragraph:
  - Identify particle mismatches, or verb-form problems.
  - Identify sentences with subject-switching problems, and reframe them.
    - a. alternating transitive and intransive.
    - b. alternating passive and active.
    - c. alternating giving and receiving.
    - d. alternating speaker=subject and addressee=subject affiliation.
  - Identify distality-shifting problems, and smooth them out.
  - Identify punctuation problems, and correct them.
- Given an “answer” (in Japanese), provide a list of questions that would elicit the information provided.

Examples:

1. We were waiting. (regular distality).
2. We were waiting. (more distal, differentiated).
3. We made you wait. (regular distality).
4. We made you wait. (more distal, differentiated).
5. This is the cat they say dances?
6. This is the cat they call Michael?
7. There are any number of people who say they have seen him dancing.
8. There are three people who say they saw him cutting lemons.
9. Even among our neighbors, there are those who say they heard him singing Beatles’ songs.
10. Given (tr. ぶつける; intr. ぶつかる):
  - I hit my head.
  - My head hit it.
  - I hit my head on the table.
  - My head hit the table.

11. Given (tr. 落とす; intr. 落ちる), (tr. 倒す; intr. 倒れる):

お父さんが福志のことを怒おこっちゃった。

= 福志が\_\_\_\_\_。

12. Given (tr. あける; intr. あく):

太郎たろうがドアを\_\_\_\_\_。

= ドアが\_\_\_\_\_。

= ドアが太郎に\_\_\_\_\_。

13. Given 読む

先生が生徒せいとに本を\_\_\_\_\_

生徒が先生\_\_\_\_\_本\_\_\_\_\_。

本が生徒に\_\_\_\_\_。

お母さんがお兄ちゃんに私の日記を\_\_\_\_\_。

日記を\_\_\_\_\_。

14. Given:

太郎が花子に道を教えてあげた。

= 花子が道を\_\_\_\_\_。
